Dear Friends,

Welcome Home! If you’ve been away for the summer and are just returning to Hollis in time for the school-year rhythm, or if your summer months have been largely spent here, Sunday, September 10<sup>th</sup> will be a day when we celebrate the home-coming and ingathering to our spiritual home of all who have been away for any length of time. At our June meeting, Church Council decided to call our celebration “Homecoming Sunday.”

Previously, our church—like a few other New England churches-- called the first Sunday of our new program year “Rally Day.” I wondered where this tradition came from, and discovered a blog post published by the Congregational Library & Archives responding to the same question:

*One book on How to Conduct a Sunday School (1905) noted that, "This festival is rapidly growing in favor. It usually comes at the end of the summer break-up, and is used as a means of rallying the forces again for the work of fall and winter." This author suggested holding the rally on the last Sunday of September, with "strong, vigorous" music and perhaps an outside speaker. The main event is a "grand review", a procession of all the Sunday-school students, from the cradle roll to the senior class, marching up to the platform and dropping off their offering envelopes in a barrel, a small plaster of Paris egg, or one time, a real pumpkin. Rally day, he enthused, "is one of the happiest days of the year."<sup>1</sup>*



# From the Christian Education Office

## Pre-Confirmation

Grade 7 and 8 students are encouraged to participate in Pre-Confirmation, a program that seeks to synthesize what is learned during the Sunday school years and prepare for the ninth grade Confirmation experience. Pre-Confirmation meets in the Emerson Chapel, once or twice a month, on Sunday mornings, beginning on September 10. ## Confirmation

Anyone in grade 9 or older is invited to join in the Confirmation program, a nine-month experience of exploration, discussion, questioning, learning and discernment that leads to a decision on con-

firming one's faith and becoming an active member of the church, with all of the rights and responsibilities that entails.

Confirmation is a big decision, but that doesn't preclude having lots of fun in the process that begins with **orientation for students and parents** after the 10:30 worship service on **Sunday, September 17**, in the Emerson Chapel. The journey continues with an **overnight retreat, Saturday, September 30-Sunday, October 1**, a trip to Boston in December, and visits to Temple Beth Abraham and the Unitarian Universalist Church in Nashua, and culminates in the Rite of Confirmation on Sunday, June 3. It will be a busy year of growth for these young people. If you have not received the schedule and registration information, contact patharris.hollis@gmail.com. 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
# Homecoming Sunday All-Church Picnic

On behalf of the entire Christian Stewardship Board, I would like to extend to you a warm and inviting ***Welcome Home!*** I personally am thankful that you have returned to us from what I hope was a wonderful summer full of much deserved rest, relaxation, and fond memories with family and friends.

As we, and most other parishioners from Churches throughout the world alike, embark upon the new curriculum year, we are reminded that “tis the season” for stewardship. For many, we attribute the “stewardship season” as a time to reflect upon and pledge our contributions to the Church through donations of our time, talent, and treasure. While this traditional approach to stewardship plays a crucial and much needed role in the vitality of the church, I would like to take this moment to focus specifically on a more simplistic adaptation of what stewardship can mean or look like.

Before offering my own interpretation, I would first like to present the meaning of “stewardship,” as defined in the Merriam Webster Dictionary:

- 1) The office, duties, and obligations of a steward.
- 2) The conducting, supervising, or managing of something.
- 3) The careful and responsible managing of something entrusted to one’s care.

To find the underlying meaning of stewardship, as it relates to our personal relationships with God, can be a confusing and perhaps an overwhelming task. We may ask ourselves, “How can I be a good steward?” We may also ask, “To what, or to whom can I be a good steward?” Even more confusing is this: “How can I be a steward to God?” While I am not able to answer those questions for you personally, I can humbly share what being a good steward means to me. Perhaps my interpretation of stewardship can assist in your own examination of, and pursuit for, the meaning of stewardship in your life.

If stewardship means to carefully and responsibly manage something that was entrusted to my care, I therefore have a responsibility to God to carefully and responsibly manage the blessings He has entrusted to me through my life. It is my responsibility to God to care for and provide for those whom I love and cherish. It is my duty to God to be a good person, and set a good example for others to follow. It is my obligation to preserve our Earth, leaving it a better place for generations of family and friends to live. It is a privilege to live the life that God has bestowed unto me. It is my honor to donate my time, talent and treasure to my church, for it is through my church that my gifts can be shared with others who are in need and truly thankful in return. It is my joy to give thanks to God for these responsibilities, duties, obligations, and privileges that I have been granted; for through God, I am truly blessed.

While you consider your contributions of time, talent, and treasure during this this year’s stewardship campaign, I encourage you to also seek out your heart’s definition of stewardship. By being a good steward towards the care of your life and the lives you touch, you are caring for what has been entrusted to you by God himself. Perhaps there is no measure of stewardship more holy.
